Betty C. Hungerford has been a professional in the field of development and public relations for more than 35 years. In December 2000, she was named to the newly created position of Director of Development at Homeland Center in Harrisburg. Hungerford is responsible for securing the financial and community resources to help support services provided in the 50 Personal Care suites and 95 Skilled Nursing Care Units of the 150-year old senior healthcare facility.

A graduate of Lebanon Valley College, she is past president of its Alumni Association, chairs the Award Committee and is a member the college's Vickroy Society. She is the recipient of an Alumni Citation and

in June 2004 was named a Distinguished Alumna of Lebanon Valley for her contributions to her profession, the community, and the college.

On May 16, 2009, her alma mater conferred an Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree upon her, noting her energetic leadership in numerous organizations, both as a professional and volunteer.

Hungerford's professional memberships include the Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP), Estate Planning Council of Central PA, Inc. (Past President) and is a past president of the Pennsylvania Public Relations Society (PPRS). She is the recipient of the Ernest R. McDowell Award presented by PPRS for sustained excellence in public relations and contributions to the community. In 2006, she was named Fundraising Professional of the Year by the Central PA Chapter of AFP and in 2007 was named a Woman of Excellence by the Harrisburg YWCA. In the spring of 2012, she was named a Woman Who Cares by Open Stage Harrisburg and, the Central PA Chapter, PRSA, awarded her the prestigious Frederick E. Leuschner Award for Excellence in Public Relations in November, 2014. Her leadership and community contributions were also recognized by Big Brothers/Big Sisters of the Capital Region with the presentation of the premier Beyond Mentoring Award on December 1, 2016.

Her community volunteer activities include: membership in the Rotary Club of Harrisburg for which she is a Past President; Harrisburg Rotary Foundation of which she is immediate past president; Theatre Harrisburg (Board Development Chair); The Civic Club of Harrisburg; PinnacleHealth Auxiliary; and Harrisburg Symphony Society. She was recognized with Rotary's Robert D. Hanson Rotary Excellence Award in 2011.

Betty treasures a 36-year marriage to Paul Hungerford who died October, 2010 and is the mother of four children, one of whom is deceased. They have 22 grandchildren. She is a member of Pine Street Presbyterian Church.

Dr. Carolyn C. Dumaresq received her bachelor's degree from Hood College, her master's degree from Villanova University, and her doctorate degree from the University of Pennsylvania.

Born in Bryn Mawr, Carolyn has worked in three school districts throughout her career: Upper Darby, Interboro, and West Chester as a math teacher, a Junior High School Principal, an Alternative High School Principal, and a Personnel Director. She was also Superintendent for both Steelton-Highspire and Central Dauphin School Districts. Carolyn worked as Executive Director of the Pennsylvania State Education Association for 12 years prior to her work

in the Department of Education. She worked in the DOE under Governors Shapp, Thornburgh, Rendell, and Corbett. Her positions ranged from Special Assistant, to Executive Director, Deputy Secretary for K-12, and finally Acting Secretary of Education. Dr. Dumaresq current works as an Adjunct Professor at Immaculata University teaching graduate level Quantitative Analysis and serves on doctoral candidate's dissertation committees.

Carolyn is currently a Rotarian; she was one of the first women inducted into Rotary and has served as the President of the Rotary Club of Harrisburg. Her other community volunteer activities include: Pennsylvania Partnerships for Children Board; Training America's Teachers Commission; Council for Public Education Executive Board; Capital Area Health Futures Task Force; Open Stage Board; Crime Stoppers of Dauphin County Advisory Board; Dauphin Dog Training Club Board; Susquehanna Service Dog Fundraising Committee; TFEC Board of Directors and Women's Fund Advisory Committee, for which she is the past Chair, and Grantmaking Subcommittee, for which she is the current Chair.

In 2014, Dr. Dumaresq was recognized for Distinguished Service by the PA Business Education Partnership and Hood College bestowed her with the Distinguished Alumni Award in 2014. Previously, she was recognized as the Community Woman of the Year by the American Association of University Women, and was Pennsylvania Superintendent of the Year in 1994.

Carolyn and her husband live in Harrisburg with their four Border Collies, which Carolyn trains, and shows in agility competitions. They also do temperament testing and transport for Glen Highland Farms, a no kill Border Collie shelter in Morris, New York. When not teaching, training, showing, and transporting they enjoy spending time with their daughters and their extended families.
