LOADS OF LOVE

Project and Community Need:

"Everyone deserves clean clothes. Loads of Love (LOL) is a free laundry service for those in our community who are unable to complete their laundry at home due to access (no washer or dryer in the home) or financial hardship. Loads of Love meets two evenings per month (the first Tuesday and third Thursday) at Trail Laundry in Duncannon and is generously sponsored by Duncannon Council of Churches. Anyone in Duncannon or the surrounding communities is welcome to join us on Loads of Love nights. Just bring your laundry - quarters and detergent provided!

Success:

Loads of Love launched in October of 2019. Since that time, we have served over 100 families in the Duncannon area and have provided over \$10,000 in dignity and respect via clean clothes. Yes, Loads of Love relieves a financial burden but, most importantly, it has allowed us to build bridges of relationship and hope in our community one load of laundry at a time. TFEC to accomplish its goals. The Agency Endowment Fund was established to make the fairgrounds self-sustaining.


