HEALTH ISSUES

- 35% of adults have obesity
- · Adult physical inactivity is 25%
- Access to health care providers
 - » Shortage of mental health providers; there is one mental health provider for every 2,720 Perry County residents (Pennsylvania average is one for every 420 people)
 - » Shortage of primary health providers; there is one primary care provider for every 3,860 Perry County residents (Pennsylvania average is one for every 1,220 people)
 - » Shortage of oral health services; there is one dentist for every 4,620 Perry County residents (Pennsylvania average is one for every 1,410 people)

ECONOMIC HARDSHIPS

- Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed (ALICE)
 Households 30% (Pennsylvania average is 28%)
- Increase in households experiencing housing cost burden where more than 30% of their income is spent on rent/ mortgage and other housing costs. In the tricounty area, 39% of renters who are cost burdened earned less than \$20,000





FOOD INSECURITY

- Food insecurity rate is 10.5%
- Number of food insecure individuals is 4,820
- Child food insecurity rate is 13.4%
